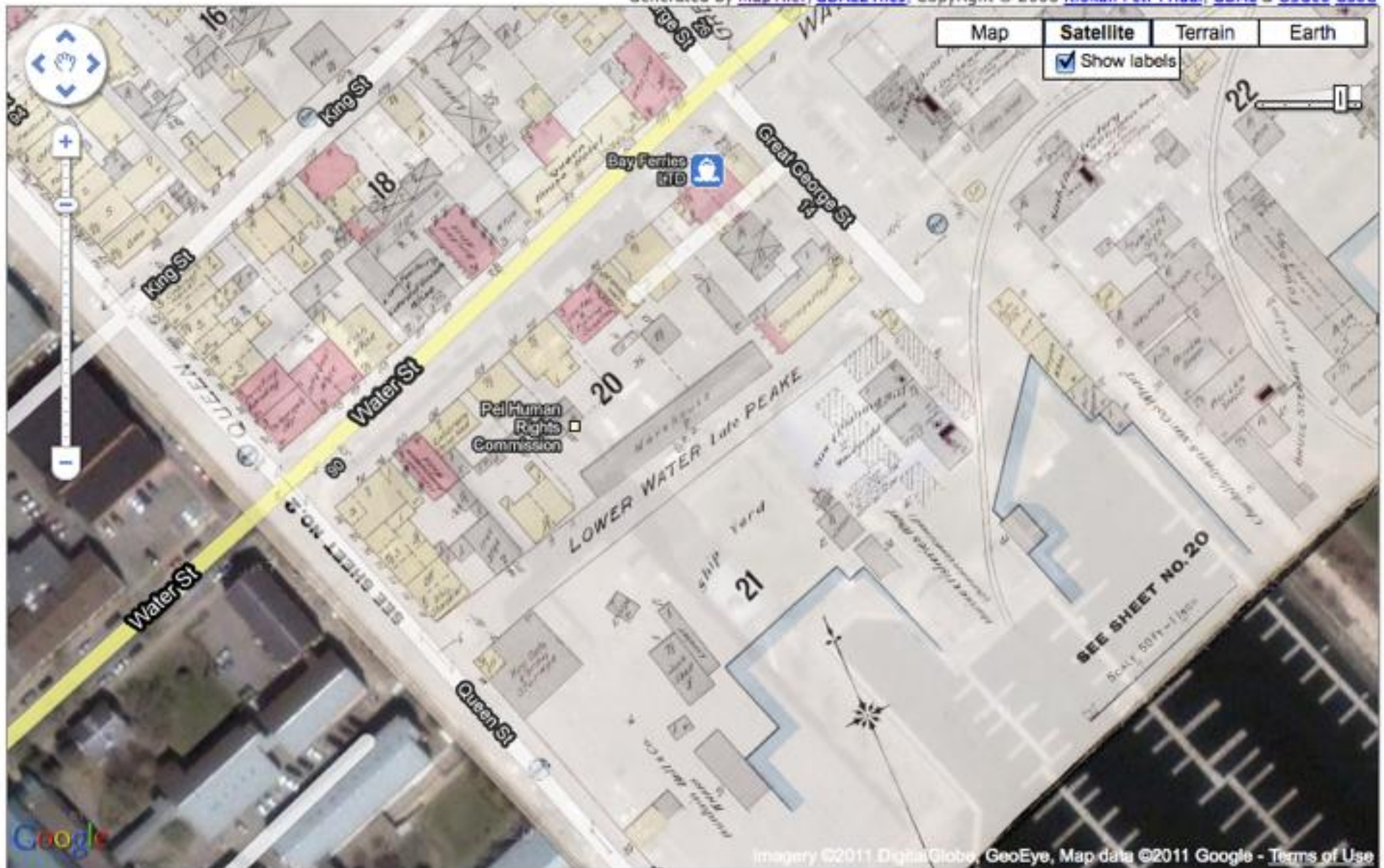

"If a trade in the country is permitted
by law, that trade has a right to be de-
fended by law. The trade of the licensed
victualler and of the sellers of alcoholic
drinks is a trade that has been and is now
permitted, and I think Parliament and
the law are not justified in inflicting on
that trade unnecessary difficulties and
irritation. . . . It has a right to de-
mand that it should not be subjected to
passionate and hasty legislation."

The speaker then proceeded to state
that Manchester and Birmingham with
a population of 400,000 each had
4,000 licensed houses, affording a liveli-
hood to 4,000 families, but in the bill
presented to Parliament there was no
"consideration of the interests of those
families, there was no valuation provided,
there was no compensation offered or
suggested, . . . and the publicans
and victuallors wherever you got a ma-
jority were to be exterminated as if they
were vermin." Referring to a letter he
had written in 1878 to a York correspon-
dent, he said that there was "no hope of
Parliamentary progress on this question
as long as the Permissive Bill blocked the
way." After explaining the advice he
gave to a committee of "the Alliance"
and its successful issue, he proceeded
thus: "What all temperance reformers
should now consider is some plan which
will unite the temperance feeling of the
country, give it power, and make its ad-
vance and progress possible." Then
speaking of what had been done else-
where in the State of Maine, where they
had legislated in the most drastic style
with a view of suppressing intemperance
by act of their State legislature, he
stated on the authority of some casual
whom he did not mention, that in
thirty years they had forty attempts at

the spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffer-
ing, goodness, faith, meekness, temper-
ance;" and the reverse side, the works of
the flesh are these: "Envyings, murders,
drunkenness, revelling" and such like.
Which of all these vices so prevalent, so
ruinous as intemperance? and could any
of these virtues exist without temperance?
Shall we then grow weary of this part of
our Christian work? No! no! rather let
us toil on, even though the work may be
distasteful, and the discouragements be
very great. "We are soldiers enlisted to
fight against the wrong;" we must expect
to endure hardships, but we are on the
Lord's side, and we know that His cause
must prevail. Doubtless there are some
Christian people who tire of them because
they feel that they have no personal in-
terest in the matter. This may be true
of the present, but can anyone be sure of
anything in the future? Mother, has this
subject no interest for you? Is there
no darling boy in the home circle toward
whose future you are looking with such
fond anticipation? Are you sure, "as
the years go by," and he goes forth from
your tender care, that he will be able to
resist the temptations of the saloon? Oh,
wife! as you lean so securely upon that
husband, are you sure that in an evil hour
he may not yield to the temptation? Have
you, then, no interest in this matter?

Press releases, site announcements, and informal blog-like entries may all be created with a *story* entry.
